

EDIT Collaboration Newsletter, December 2021

PROGRESS UPDATE

- We have identified 25 trials of weight management interventions conducted in adolescents and 55 conducted in adults meeting our <u>inclusion criteria</u>, with a combined total sample of 11,514 participants.
- Invitations to trialists to join the collaboration have been sent over the last two weeks. So far, representatives from 28 trials have agreed to join the collaboration.
